PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This past year, each of the Board of Directors received a plaque, recognizing them for their leadership, professionalism and commitment to the membership of F.A.C.E. It is safe to say, that this year's Board is living up to these same expectations. The Board met in November for a one-day session (a really long day) and covered a tremendous amount of material. In an organization that covers an area as large as F.A.C.E. and boasts a membership of more than 2,000 professional code officers, it is imperative that we adhere to the direction outlined in our strategic plan. Recapping our objectives and responsibilities at the beginning of each Board meeting serves as a reminder of the tasks and goals we set early on. Reports were as follows:

1st VP – **Frank Cassidy** gave an in depth overview of the 2010 Education and Training Seminar format along with the logistics of obtaining your needed 16 hours of continuing education credits. The Board gave approval on both the format and the list of classes. The Program Committee is now working to secure speakers/presenters and the committee wants to have the agenda ready for print by early March.

Sergeant-at-Arms – **Hector Garcia** presented the Board with three proposals complete with scope of services from companies vying to represent F.A.C.E. as our legislative lobbyists. In the end, the Board decided to postpone offering a contract at this time due in part to the high cost, and timing of the legislative session.

Treasurer – **James Acosta** gave an up-to-date budget report complete with back up for each Board member to read over and follow along with during his presentation. Included in the Treasurer's report is the first-ever proposed Education and Training Seminar budget separate from the overall operating budget. Having a separate training budget will help

the overall operating budget. Having a separate training budget will help with a more accurate forecasting of expenses and revenues associated with our annual training seminar.

Secretary – **Lori Mobley** presented the Board with minutes to approve and the signature page for the President to sign certifying the minutes for posting.

Immediate Past President – **Shawn O'Rourke** provided an updated report on the certification fee-sharing project. **Marilyn Crotty** of the IOG offered to set-up a meeting with F.A.C.E. and the Institute of Government Directors around the state.

This particular edition of the *President's Message* was fun to write. It is filled with exciting news and accomplishments that the entire association can feel good about. This Board has set matters of importance, such as communication, a state-recognized educational program, and professional liaison to organizations like the Florida League of Cities and the Florida Association of Counties as priorities. F.A.C.E. is making tremendous strides in all of these areas by the tireless efforts and dedication of the Board of Directors and those serving on committees, providing immeasurable assistance in these pursuits.

Communication is essential to the growth of any professional organization, and F.A.C.E. is no exception. To help get our message out to as many members as possible, Board members will be visiting different regions of the state, sharing strategic goals and what is planned to attain them. Also, in January, Membership Chair **Dot Hird**, along with Sergeant-at-Arms **Hector Garcia** and Secretary **Lori Mobley** will be visiting the South Florida/Miami area to assist members from that region of the state form a new F.A.C.E. chapter. Chapters are the lifeline of any professional association and are the much-needed pipeline to disseminate information both quickly and accurately.

On November 17th, Immediate Past President *Shawn O'Rourke* and I attended a meeting in Orlando that was set up by **Marilyn Crotty** with the Directors of the Institutes of Government from around the state. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the proposal of fee-sharing connected to with F.A.C.E. certification courses. This meeting was extremely positive with both organizations excited and determined to get this project completed. I am optimistic that we will have contracts in place by early next year with each of the Institutes involved with providing F.A.C.E. certification courses. The intent behind Immediate Past President O'Rourke's project is to lower the costs associated with attaining continuing education credits to maintain your F.A.C.E. certifications. These anticipated revenues will be earmarked for the education portion of the budget.

The following day I, along with Immediate Past President **Shawn O'Rourke**, 1st VP **Frank Cassidy** and Sergeant-at-Arms **Hector Garcia**, met with attorneys **Kraig Conn** and **Kenneth Pratt** from the Florida League of Cities. **Bob Hamilton**, F.A.C.E. Board Attorney, made the introductions and facilitated the meeting. The meeting was scheduled to discuss the pending legislation "*Hidden Liens*." **Bob Hamilton** was outstanding in his ability to convey the concerns of our membership with particular portions of this legislation. The pending legislation is not likely to move forward. **Bob Hamilton** illustrated the importance of F.S. 162 referring to it as the code enforcement officers Bible and further described F.A.C.E. members as experts on F.S. 162. With this, the League of Cities accepted our offer to assist and have agreed to contact F.A.C.E. for input on future proposed legislative changes to F.S. 162. This in itself is great news for our association but even more exciting is the fact that the League of Cities accepted a copy of our proposed state certification language. This is very significant for membership of F.A.C.E.

I would like to remind our membership that it is important that we remain focused as an organization and attentive to our duties. Change is not a concept that happens over night. Change requires perseverance and patience and most importantly the discipline to stay on task.

As I write in each edition of the *INTERFACE*, my role this year is to represent F.A.C.E. professionally, and to stay on point with our strategic plan. I would like to express my sincere appreciation to each Board member for working as hard as you do and to **Marilyn Crotty** and **Bob Hamilton** for providing invaluable contributions to ensure our continued success.

The next day President **Terry Suggs**, 1st VP **Frank Cassidy**, Sergeant at Arms **Hector Garcia**, Attorney **Bob Hamilton** and I met with attorneys from the Florida League of Cities (**Kenneth Pratt** and **Kraig Conn**) regarding possible legislative changes, some of which were in F.S. 162. That meeting was also very productive and through the graces and influence of **Bob Hamilton** - we were assured that we (F.A.C.E.) would be in the loop and have input on any language relating to F. S. 162. By the way, the proposed language did not have much momentum and doesn't appear to be going anywhere soon (and especially not in its original draft format) but the point is F.A.C.E. will be in the loop on any future proposed changes.

A side benefit that came out of that meeting was an opportunity to present our idea and language for State Certification. We did not get any comment from the two attorneys from the League, but just the opportunity to sit at the table and present the idea and language was a definite plus.

There was a lot of behind the scenes work going on to facilitate those meetings with the IOG's and Florida League of Cities attorneys. Special thanks to Marilyn and Bob for their input and assistance on making those happen, and kudos to the Board members who took time from their jobs to prepare for and attend those meetings.

If you too are passionate, committed and willing to work, I'll soon be soliciting your name to run for a seat on the Board of Directors. If you are not quite sure you are ready for that leap of faith then consider being on a committee next year. Being on a committee will give you a good sense of the time and commitment you'll need to make to run for office, so don't hesitate – get involved.

Time to Take Ownership of what is Ours!

Code enforcement has come a long way in the 19 years I have been a part of it. F.A.C.E. turns 21 this year and the challenges of today's economy are providing an excellent opportunity for code enforcement to stand up and show communities how valuable we really are. From a branch out from law enforcement to stand-alone agencies with our own associations and training, the years have been good to us.

Over the last year or so, I have been stressing the importance of developing value in yourself and your organization. It is now time to start looking at our roots and taking ownership of those things that are at the foundation of our profession. This article will take a very quick look at one of them, the Broken Window Theory.

The Broken Window Theory:

...is an outcome of 'Broken Window', the title of a 1982 article by criminologist James Q. Wilson and George Kelling. This simple theory argues that a broken window left unrepaired will make a building look uncared for or abandoned and soon attract vandals to break all the other windows.

Broken Window Theory suggests that the prevention of crime will be accomplished by steps like painting over graffiti, keeping buildings in good repair, maintaining clean streets and parks and responding effectively to petty street crime. Sociologyindex, Sociology Books 2009, Philip Zimbardo

In the above quote, we can see that this theory is based on the addressing of blight in early stages. The concept is simple: if one broken window is left unattended, then people will be more apt to break other windows and the neighborhood will display a feeling of uncaring and an inability to stay maintained. This will lead to crime and so the down slide begins; blight begets blight and communities become infected with crime.

You can see that this theory is fairly new, the early eighties. We are fairly new. There is an argument that can support that this theory is actually the birth of modern code enforcement. Code enforcement becomes the primary tool for crime prevention and the main proactive method for handling crime; we are the front line on blight.

Is this not what code enforcement does?

What are our objectives: Protect property values; maintain and encourage economic viability; protect the health, safety and welfare of communities; and maintain attractive and livable communities.

Does this not all include crime prevention?

You bet it does and I for one will state that code enforcement is the only agency protecting communities from blight and taking a proactive role in crime prevention.

Although short, I think you get the gist of this article. I am simply providing another tool for us to use to show how valuable we are to communities. If you want to research on your own, try it - look up the broken window theory and I know you'll find the more research you do the more you see how it is ours; it is a code enforcement theory and we need to start using it. Take ownership of these theories that are ours, and keep looking for others as well.

- **Administrative Aspects of Code Enforcement (Level II)** 40 hours of classes and passage of examination
- **Legal Aspects of Code Enforcement (Level III)** 36 hours of classes and passage of examination
- **Officer Safety and Field Applications (Level IV)** 30 hours of classes and passage of examination

• **Code Enforcement Professional (CEP)**

Requires three years employment in Code Enforcement, certification in Fundamentals (I), Administrative Aspects (II), and Legal Aspects (III), and writing and passing of an approved legal issue research paper (5 hours CEH credit given.)
