111 112 Legislation Related to Public Record Exemptions to SB 60

There is legislation being proposed in Tallahassee that would amend the current legislation of anonymous code enforcement complaints, which would allow citizens to apply for an exemption to remain anonymous for approximately one (1) year. This would essentially lead to code enforcement agencies to redact complainant's information during that one (1) year period from any public records requests. It is unknown how this would impact agencies' records management or if it would lead to an increase in anonymous complaints.

# **PACE Seminar Committee**
